These vast expanses of land define Argentina as the "horsemen" country of excellence. Enjoy access to the estancia facilities, its park and stables, and an array of activities, such as horseback and sulky rides. This estancia is still productive in the traditional sense, so you can also witness the rural activities typically dedicated to cattle breeding. The park and surrounding ranch land - with its natural lagoons and small water systems coursing to the Areco River - offer a rich habitat to a large proportion of Argentina's thousand different bird species. No ranch visit would be complete without a proper asado; the typical Argentinean barbecue of the world's finest beef, raised free-range on the estancia.

You'll visit a local artisan workshop to discover the secrets of gaucho silversmith, and/or Museo las Lilas, which features drawings of gaucho lifestyle. From there, you'll continue on to Estancia La Bamba, enjoying some lunch and having time to relax and absorb the serene bliss of the natural surroundings, additionally with an opportunity to take a horseback ride in the countryside. La Bamba, whose origins date back to 1830 when it formed one of the post houses on the "Camino Real" (Royal Road) that linked Buenos Aires to the north of the country, is one of the oldest Argentinean colonial-style estancias. It's steeped in rich Argentine and Gaucho history, evident in its main building and its guard tower which served to defend against native attacks, its former stables (La Pulperia), and its 200-year-old sprawling park. La Bamba retained its name when it was transformed into an estancia in the early twentieth century and, in keeping an active part of Argentine - and particularly gaucho - heritage, La Bamba de Areco is proud to offer authentic gaucho traditions such as asados (barbecue) and mate tasting. Excursions on horseback, by carriage, or mountain bike, Argentinian bowls game, the ample swimming pool and the numerous spaces in which you can relax, all offer the traveler an unforgettably restful and rejuvenating experience.

Enjoy access to the estancia facilities, its park and stables, and an array of activities, such as Argentinean bowls game, mountain biking, and horseback or sulky rides. The estancia is still productive in the traditional sense, so you can also witness the rural activities typically dedicated to cattle breeding. The park and surrounding ranch land - with its natural lagoons and small water systems coursing to the Areco River - offer a rich habitat to a large proportion of Argentina's thousand different bird species. Breathe in the fresh air, take in the spectacular views, and simply enjoy the numerous spaces in which you can relax, all of which offer you an unforgettably restful and rejuvenating experience.



Another important point during the trip is as you are passing Sarmiento's Museum, where the former president's weekend house can be seen, covered by glass. Sailing by small rivers and streams, you will enjoy one of the most marvelous places oft-chosen by Argentinian families, discovering the typical Delta houses on stilts, and various schools and chapels, which are a big part of Delta's lifestyle.
